

# 'Shining Stars' Return for the Founders Fund 2015 Scholars Luncheon



#### COLLEGE EDUCATION STATS

With tuition and education costs on the rise almost every semester, students looking to attend college in the fall are faced with the highest costs in collegiate history.

When the Founders Fund began in 1991, the average cost of tuition, fees, room and board at a four year university was \$5,585 for Full-Time/In-State students. This is according to the U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics.

The U.S. Department of Education reported that the average cost of undergraduate tuition, fees, room, and board for the 2011-2012 school year was \$14,292. As statistics show, education prices are continually on the rise. Deserving Collier County students need the help and support of scholarships such at the Founders Fund now more than ever.

# The Founders Fund

Since its inception in 1991, 565 students have been awarded more than \$3 million in scholarships.

Last spring, 28 Collier County students were awarded \$8,000 scholarships for college and post high school education. The renewable scholarships are given in the amount of \$2,000 each year to students maintaining a B average or better in their college studies.
